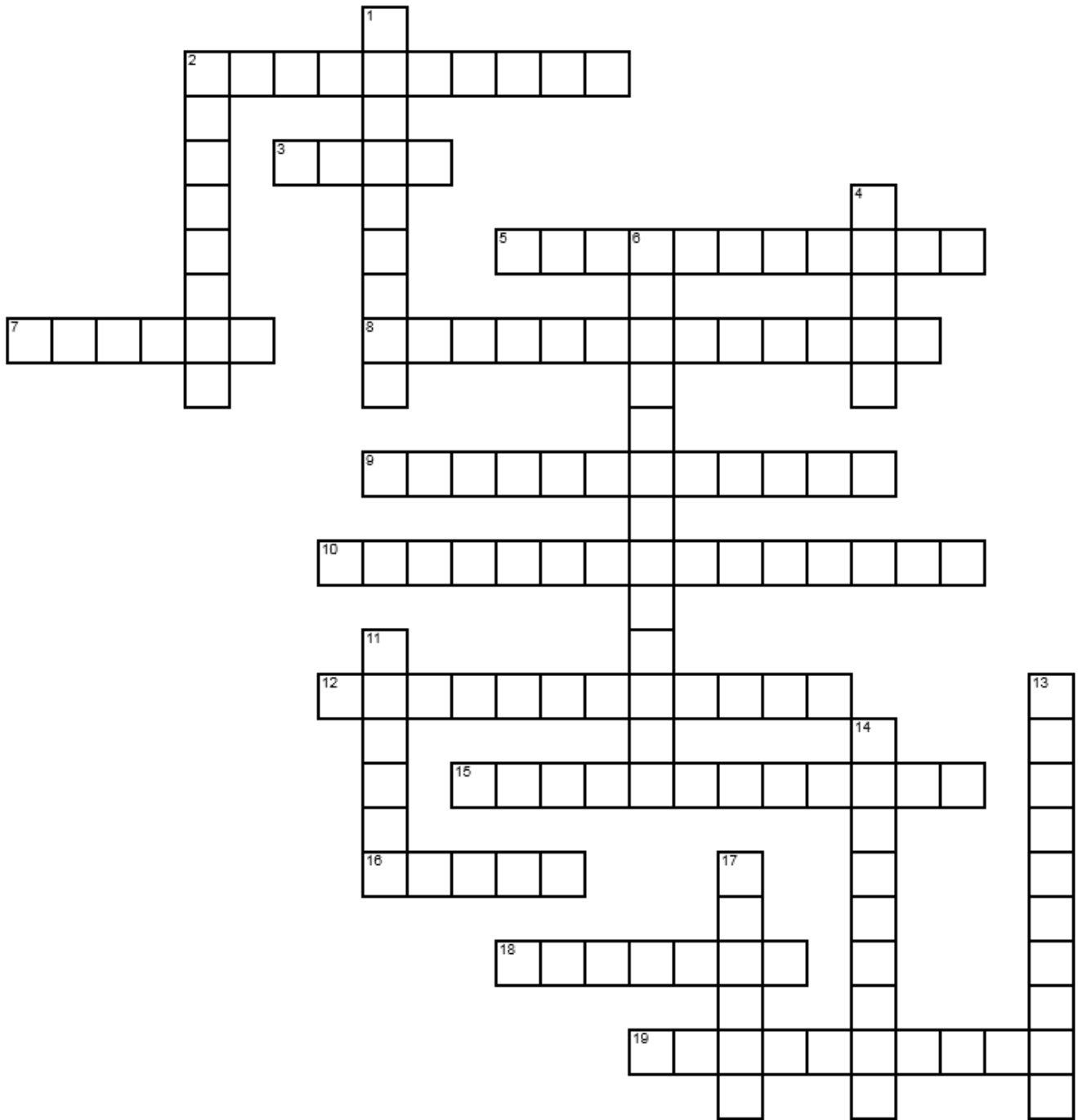

- 8 The type of food that is traditionally eaten during Shavuot, including cheese and milk.
- 9 The act of praising God for His provision and goodness
- 10 God's laws that were given to Moses.
- 12 The agricultural products of Israel, including two grains and five fruits, that are listed in the Bible.
- 15 Another biblical name for Shavout, which refers to the time span between Passover and Shavuot.
- 16 The Hebrew word for the Five Books of Moses.
- 18 The Jewish holiday that celebrates the grain harvest and the giving of the Torah.
- 19 The mountain where God gave Moses the Ten Commandments.
