- 2 A Jewish holiday that celebrates the annual reading of the Torah, from Genesis to Deuteronomy, which immediately follows Sukkot
- **3** Time of year Sukkot is held and what it also celebrates
- 6 Name of event when the Jews left Egypt, which is commemorated during Sukkot
- **9** The proper greeting during Sukkot which means "joyous festival"
- 12 Another name for Sukkot found in Leviticus 23:33-34
- 17 A booth made of wood, canvas, or other materials that Jews are commanded to live for the seven days of Sukkot (Leviticus 23:42-43)
- 18 A lemon-shaped fruit with thick, dense skin that is part of the four species
- 20 Another name for Sukkot mentioned in Exodus 23:16

- 1 The holiday immediately following Sukkot that is a transitional day back to daily routines (Leviticus 23:39)
- 4 Name of the Hebrew month in which Sukkot occurs; typically, September-October on the Gregorian calendar
- 5 Date palm fronds that are waved each day during Sukkot
- 7 Place where Jews wandered for forty years on their way to the Promised Land
- 8 The Book of the Bible that is traditionally read during Sukkot
- **10** Important symbols of Sukkot that represents the blessings of nature (Leviticus 23:40)
- **11** Collection of psalms (Psalms 113-118) that are recited each day during Sukkot
- 13 U.S. holiday inspired by Sukkot
- 14 One of the three pilgrimage festivals, also known as "The Festival of Booths"
- 15 The holiday immediately preceding Sukkot
- 16 Book of the Bible that foretells the celebration of the Feast of Tabernacles during messianic time
- 19 Special prayers said during Sukkot, from which the English word "hosanna" is derived
