## 'God Bless You for Your Help!'

Tzivya knows how it feels to be desperately lonely. She lost her husband six years ago and has been grieving ever since. Most nights, Tzivya is so anxious that she cannot fall asleep until 5 a.m. "I listen to prayers on the radio. It calms me down somewhat, but then I remain in complete silence."

This silence drags on, and she waits for someone — anyone — to visit.

Her son lives nearby, but he is dealing with his own physical and mental health challenges, so he cannot visit often. Her granddaughter, Daniela, does visit, the one light in Tzivya's life. She visits and cooks for Tzivya a few hours a day, while Tzivya looks after her granddaughter's new baby.

These hours are precious, but pass too quickly, and then Tzivya — who is hard of hearing, nearly blind, and suffers from diabetes — is left alone for most of the day feeling forgotten. But because of you, *The Fellowship* stepped in with immediate help. Tzivya needs many medicines on a daily basis, but you help cover the additional costs not provided by the Israeli government. We also knew she'd benefit from calls by *Fellowship* volunteers to cheer her up. The first time we called, she teared up with emotion because of how much this extra attention means to her.

Tzivya isn't forced to sit in silence anymore. She couldn't stop repeating: "God bless you for your help!" And she means it with all her heart.

## As Rockets Fall, Mushka Has You

Eighty-four-year-old Mushka was in the shower when a code red siren went off, signaling an incoming rocket. She lives in Sderot, an Israeli town frequently exposed to rockets from Hamas, and panics every time she hears explosions.

Most Israelis panic. But Mushka is a Holocaust survivor, so she's doubly traumatized by these attacks — the loud noises bring her right back to WWII in a flash. This time, the blaring sound knocked her off her feet, and she was unable to get up as water kept flowing out of the shower head. She immediately called her Fellowship volunteer, Tonya, for help. "Thank God Mushka brought her phone into the bathroom," Tonya says.

This support wouldn't be possible without you. The Fellowship has so many volunteers willing to support our elderly in times of crisis. "We need to reach out to them, to help them, to care for them," Tonya says, "and I am eternally grateful to be a part of such an amazing organization, The Fellowship."

After Mushka's call, Tonya called an ambulance and went with Mushka to the hospital where she stayed with her until 3 a.m. This is the kind of care all Holocaust survivors deserve. We are so happy to not only provide them with bomb shelters, but with caring volunteers who check up on them when they need it most. And you make it all possible!

## A Completely Different World

When Tomer and his family moved to southern Israel, they looked forward to living a simpler life. But they found it was harder than they had imagined.

Tomer supports the family by working nights cleaning out water tanks at a factory. And instead of being surrounded by the IDF soldiers and border police who protect Israelis in places like Jerusalem or Tel Aviv, Tomer and his family live just two miles from Gaza, where terrorists launch rockets and balloons carrying explosive devices at Israel.



When sirens sound, his family drags "mattresses into a public shelter that is a 20-second run from our house."

Twenty seconds.

That seems like a brief period of time but for scared children scurrying in the dead of night, fearing a missile could crash down on them at any time, it's an eternity.

That's why the bomb shelters that you provide are so important! They mean Tomer's children will live in safety and security, not fear.

### 'The Fellowship Simply Saved Us!'

Yury and Maryia, a married couple from Belarus in the FSU, never anticipated the aliyah process would halt and flights would be canceled due to a global pandemic.

In 2019, they began the immigration process. They remember the excitement they felt on New Year's Eve when they held their new passports and learned their immigration documents had been approved. Most of Yury's family suffered terribly in the Holocaust, so being able to raise his children and worship freely in the Jewish homeland felt like a long-awaited answer to his prayers.

"We talked about Israel," Yury explains. "We made plans." They quit their jobs. They told their three children about the move. Then the pandemic hit, and everything was stalled.

Jobless and worried, the family had no way of receiving aid from the Belarusian government after giving up their regular passports. Even more troubling was the fact that Maryia needed medicine and continued medical care after surviving a battle with cancer five years ago. "We were helpless" she remembers.

That's when you stepped in. The family learned about the special Fellowship assistance you made possible that helped olim (immigrants) who were forced to wait to make aliyah. While still in Belarus, the family received monetary assistance from The Fellowship that helped them survive. "The Fellowship simply saved us!" says Yury.
